

Skin Biopsy, Suture Area, and Skin Cancer Destruction Instructions

- 1. Keep the area clean and dry for today. Starting tomorrow change the wound dressing once or twice a day.
- 2. Wash your hands with antibacterial soap and water. Then wash the area with antibacterial soap and water.
- 3. Gently pat dry.
- 4. Apply a white petrolatum-based ointment to the area, like Aquaphor or Vaseline.
- 5. Keep the area covered with a band-aid or non-stick pad (like Telfa or Sorbalux) with paper tape until fully healed.

Certain areas like lower legs take a long time to heal (often over a month).

A skin cancer destruction can take a month or longer to heal on any site. Continue wound care until fully healed. Make sure to keep ointment on the area and not to let a scab form.

Do not submerge the site in pools, oceans, rivers, or streams until fully healed.

Possible Signs of Infection:

- 1. Large area of redness
- 2. Swelling
- 3. Warmth
- 4. Drainage or pus
- 5. Pain
